October 5: What is Domestic Violence Part 1—Participants will learn to identify the types of domestic violence, the cycle of violence, and the power and control wheel.

October 12: What is Domestic Violence Part 2—Continued from Part 1.

October 19: Teen Dating and Healthy Relationships—Participants will learn about teen dating violence and how to help teens define healthy relationships through building trust.

October 26: Domestic Violence in the Workplace—Participants will learn how domestic violence often impacts work performance, how organizations as a whole are affected, and how employees can support survivors.
